FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK




Every year in September, the senior leadership of the Methodist Church of Southern Africa gathers for Conference. If you're not familiar with the language, that's another word to add to your Methodist lexicon - Conference (not a conference), but a gathering of leaders at Conference. Yes, it's a bit confusing:)

This year, Conference is special: it will be preceded by a three day Mission Congress, which is the culmination of a journey over the last couple of years that our church has called the Pilgrimage of Renewal. Beginning with a call from our Presiding Bishop, Rev Pumla Nzimande, the MCSA has been listening to feedback from members and communities, asking ourselves where we need to grow and be renewed and what that will look like. The Mission Congress will involve nearly 400 delegates from across the sub-continent and our aim is to discern what God is saying to us in the areas of Spirituality, Discipleship & Evangelism; Prophetic Witness & Social Justice; Leadership, Governance and Ministerial Well-being; Sustainable Resources and Innovative Communication; and African identity and contextual theology.

Our deep hope is that this will be more than a talk shop and that the findings of the Congress will shape the decisions to be made at Conference this year in wise and practical ways. I will be privileged to be a part of the Mission Congress (and will be heading up to Joburg after the 09h00 service). Please pray that God will speak and we will hear during this important week.



July and August were filled with transformation as we watched the men in our program not only gain valuable new skills but also grow spiritually. We are deeply grateful to each one of you who has made this mission possible. Your love, prayers, and support are changing lives.

The saying is true: many hands make light work.
Together, we can continue to bring hope and transformation.

A team from America joined us to carry out much-needed construction repairs at Giba, our outreach campsite. Giba continues to be a safe place for connection, spiritual healing, and restoration—a space where hurting individuals, both children and adults, can step away from hardship and encounter hope.

Eight men from Vulindlela were selected to assist and gain practical skills in painting, tiling, and bricklaying. It was inspiring to see their confidence soar as they discovered how capable they truly are.

## STORIES OF TRANSFORMATION

- Michael's Journey: Michael has been a faithful member of Vulindlela from the start, walking all the way from Chesterville every Tuesday and Thursday to attend meetings. He was also one of the men selected for upskilling at Giba. He had been earning R150 a day, but recently shared the good news that he now has additional work earning double that! A testimony of God's faithfulness when we simply say, "Yes Lord, I am here."
- Thabiseng's Breakthrough: While jogging one morning, I met Thabiseng Khubala, who has moved from unemployment to working five days a week. He credits the lessons he learned at Vulindlela—especially about presenting himself well for job opportunities—as key to his success. Now he can pay rent, buy food, and repay debts. His words were: "Wow, I need to come and tell the men that the stuff you guys tell us really works! You really care about us!"
- Sbahle's New Beginning: After just four months in the program, Sbahle Khabanyana has found full-time employment as a driver. He sent us a heartfelt message: "Thank you for not giving up on me and for speaking the truth in love." Sometimes, the truth is hard to hear—but it is often what leads to real change.

A CALL FOR PRAYER

Not every story is easy, but we believe what is impossible for man is possible for God. Please pray for Themba Sparks, who is currently living on the streets, struggling with alcohol, and feeling cut off from his family. May he find hope, healing, and a new path forward.
